SUMMER SESSION I CLASS WITH TRAVEL TO ELDORET AND NAIROBI, KENYA

In addition to developing journalism skills, students will learn about the basic pathology of the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), the history of acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS) with particular attention to sub-Saharan Africa, and current efforts aimed at addressing the worldwide epidemic. Students will do multimedia reporting on the topic from Eldoret, Kenya, during a three-week visit to the IU-Kenya Partnership's AMPATH project.

TRAVEL DATES: May 20 to June 12, 2011

PREREQUISITES: at least junior standing and successful completion of J110, J200 and J210 (for graduate students, J505)

COST: The cost of this trip for students is \$2,000 in addition to the Summer Session I tuition cost. The School of Journalism heavily subsidizes this course, which costs approximately \$4,000 per student.

Students will be charged a non-refundable \$500 deposit upon acceptance to the course and the remaining summer tuition of \$1,500. This fee covers round-trip travel from Bloomington to Kenya, all accommodations and travel while in Kenya, meals while in Eldoret, a safari excursion, and some activities.

Students should have additional funds to cover personal expenses such as meals, souvenirs and any other personal items. We recommend students have between \$200 and \$400 in an ATM-accessible account to cover these expenses.
